The Highlights of Our Collections

The Quaker Heritage Center

The Quaker Heritage Center offers exhibits on the Quaker history of activism and issues such as peacemaking, civil rights, racism and social justice.

The Peace Resource Center

The Peace Resource Center holds the “Hiroshima and Nagasaki Memorial Collection” –a collection of historical documents, photographs, audio, and film related to the atomic bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki, as well as peace movements and peace-making.
