

Intern Title: Zoology DNA Lab Intern

Background: The re-opened Union Terminal includes a fully functional genetic research lab that can be viewed through glass walls from the public exhibit spaces. This space is dedicated to animal research (no human genetic work will be conducted). The goals of the lab are to 1) continue the museum's contribution to scientific research, and 2) educate the public about the research being done at the museum and basic genetic methods/applications. This position will require both lab work inside and public interaction outside the lab.

Location: Cincinnati Museum Center at Union Terminal, 1301 Western Ave., Cincinnati, OH

Key Responsibilities:

- Help prepare and process tissue samples for genetic analysis, including
 - o DNA extraction
 - Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR)
 - Gel Electrophoresis
 - DNA sequencing and/or microsatellite marker analysis
 - Data analysis
- Guest Interaction
 - o Interact with museum guests outside the lab
 - o Discuss current research projects and interpret research activities happening in the lab
 - Aid staff in development of programs/activities for implementation outside the lab
- Other work to be assigned in assistance of Zoology Curator

Requirements:

- Current College/University student
- Successful completion of a genetics course with lab, or other genetics lab experience
- Excellent attention to detail
- Good organizational abilities
- Interest in zoology, biology, or related field
- Familiar with spreadsheet databasing (Excel)

Length of Appointment: 10 weeks
